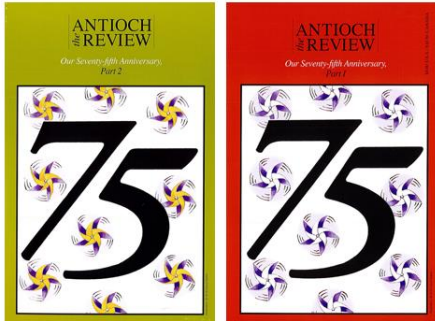


# Lovers of Literature:

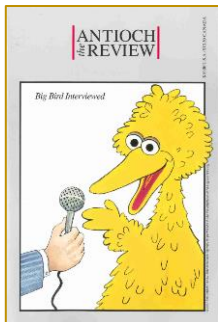
the honor of being one of the oldest, continuously publishing literary magazines in America with an international readership and reputation for publishing “the best words in the best order” for over 75 years.

We are proud of our history of publishing prominent and promising poets, authors, and critics—some only emerging upstarts when originally featured. Authors published in the

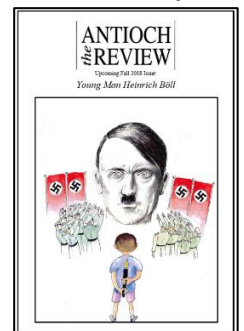
