ENTRY INFORMATION FOR NINETEENTH ANNUAL AWARD

1. Winning entry will be published by **Livingston Press at The University of West Alabama**, in simultaneous trade paper and ebook editions. Winner will receive \$1000, plus our standard royalty contract, which includes 60 copies of the book.


2. Author must not have a story collection published or under contract at time of entry; however, novels or poetry collections do not disqualify the author.

3. Stories may have been previously published by magazines or in anthologies--we in fact encourage the same. The author should have all reprint rights. Magazines will be acknowledged.

- 4. Manuscripts must be sent to jwt@uwa.edu as a Word Document file.
- 5. Manuscript length: 150-275 pages.
- 6. Deadline for receipt: December 31, 2023.

- 8. Winner announced in the early summer, with publication next summer.
- 9. Winner must be an American citizen; work must be in English.
- 10. Style and content of manuscripts are completely open.
